After a decade of extraordinary service, Wyayn Rasmussen, Ed.D., Executive Director of Academy of Whole Learning, announced her retirement.

Kim Snow, a current trustee and parent, will start immediately as Interim Executive Director for a smooth transition. The Board will initiate a search for the permanent Executive Director in the next six months.
